Between the poor weather and a busy holiday season, I decided to start my farm tours in my own state of Kentucky. You may not know this, but Kentucky, best known for horses, is also the largest beef cattle producing state east of the Mississippi. Kentucky currently has 18 Belted Galloway member farms and 297 registered cattle.

This month our profile farm is Pike Valley Farm, located in Lancaster. Encompassing 150 acres, it is located on beautiful Lake Herrington. The farm is owned by Winston and Teresa Pike and is Certified Organic. The Pike's have seven children and their three oldest sons Joshua, Daniel, and Mark (pictured with Winston and Teresa) are now taking active roles on the farm. It's great to see young farmers making the transition to operating the family farm. Winston, who is in the Air National Guard, is now training to be a Flight Engineer while Teresa, who home schooled their children, has recently enrolled in Nursing School. As the parents take on new careers, their sons begin leadership roles on the farm.



To further their knowledge of organic and sustainable farming, sons Daniel and Joshua just completed a yearlong internship with the well-known sustainable farmer, Joel Salatin, of Polyface Farm in Staunton, Virginia.

Pike Valley Farm brought their first Belties to the farm in 2005 from Sun Valley Farm (Bob and Lyndall Mack in Wisconsin) and have grown their Beltie herd to nearly 100 animals. Even with close to 50 brood cows, they find it a challenge to keep up with the demand for their beef from direct marketing efforts. To make Pike Valley Farm even more marketable they added organic pork, chicken, and eggs. In addition their son Daniel is now raising meat rabbits to add additional revenue.

Teresa, who has spearheaded their marketing efforts sells beef both on and off the farm as

quarters, halves, and even individual cuts. You can also find their products at food co-ops, and restaurants. They have had great success with food buying clubs in several nearby cities, and are also selling beef to a local college. Even the best marketing efforts will fail without a competent processor. The Pike's have established a great working relationship with local USDA processor Marksbury Farm Market, located less than 10 miles from the farm. Marksbury processes their beef, pork and even their chicken. They have a new facility and informative website at [www.marksburyfarm.com](http://www.marksburyfarm.com).

With the Beltie's grassfed diet, the Pikes are frequently rotating their cattle to fresh pasture. Many of their pastures have native fescue, which in Kentucky, allows winter grazing in mild winters and greatly reduces the need for hay. They recently took advan-

tage of a NRCS cost share program, and installed automatic waterers throughout the farm. Check out the many cost share programs available for your farm at [www.NRCS.USDA.gov](http://www.NRCS.USDA.gov).

My hat goes off to the Pike family for identifying multiple markets for their Beltie beef and then expanding into other meat products. By getting their sons involved in the business they create an extension of themselves. Their sons are bringing new ideas and lots of energy to further grow Pike Valley Farm

It involves working evenings, weekends at shows, sales, meetings and events. ## Belted Galloway bulls on test

Kirkwood Community College of Cedar Rapids, Iowa conducts an annual bull test. The test, is conducted by Terry Chapman, Professor of Animal Science, who some of you will recall was the judge at the 2011 National Belted Galloway Show in Louisville.

This year, five Belted Galloway Bulls from three different sires were entered in this year's test by Tom Jr. and Robin Brown of How Now Farms of Cedar Rapids.

According to Professor Chapman, "The bull test is primarily a community service providing a location for small producers to collectively develop bull prospects. Most consignors, especially smaller producers, don't have the facilities or time to develop a small number of bulls. We collect rate of gain information, ultrasound composition, and semen evaluations on the group of bulls collectively and thus more economically. Secondly, the bull test provides the students

with a different set of skills than would be required with feedlot steers."

The test itself is for spring born bulls, calved January through April. Weights vary greatly on incoming cattle depending both on breed and management prior to arrival at the College. Typically, bulls going on test at a minimum of 600 pounds get along better as there is competition in the pens. In November, bulls are weighed upon arrival. At four weeks, and at interim times periodically throughout the testing period. Ultrasounding for carcass composition takes place in March and in mid-April the bulls are semen checked.

Bulls are all fed the same ration composed of ground hay, wet distillers and or wet gluten, dry shelled corn, and high moisture corn with a co-product balancer. The top diet for bulls contains 58Mcal N/Eg. Once the test is completed, the bulls are hardened with a lower energy diet.

These five Belted Galloway bulls are the first ever on test at Kirkwood. As of today, one of the bulls is running an ADG of 3#/ day, with the others not far behind. The conclusion of the test will be published in an upcoming newsletter.

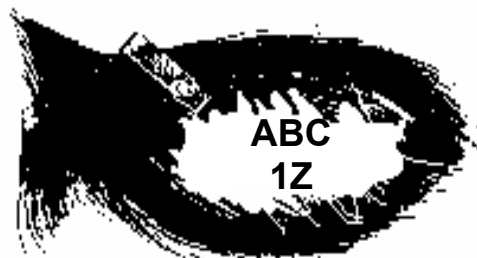

If he's reached breeding age (around 18 months), it's definitely a plus to have his semen checked for quantity and motility.

Any data available should appear in your advertisement along with his birth date and the names of his sire and dam. **Further, it is required that registration numbers be included on bulls advertised for sale in the Hotline and newsletter.**




