2011 A. H. Chatfield Scholarship Announcement

The A.H. Chatfield, Jr. Memorial Scholarship was established by members of the Belted Galloway Society in memory of A.H. Chatfield, Jr. of Rockport, ME. Mr. Chatfield's Aldermere Farm provided much of this country's foundational breeding stock. He spent 50 years raising Belted Galloways, preserving and promoting the breed.

The selection process includes judging each applicant's written essay, involvement in the Belted Galloway breed, leadership participation, community service and scholastic standing.

Council is supporting a recommendation to The Foundation to continue the (3) \$500 Chatfield scholarships, but to undertake a fundraising effort to initiate a larger \$1,500 annual scholarship in addition to the scholarships offered.

In Memoriam

Robert L. Knott

Bob Knott, 73, succumbed to a failing heart on May 19, 2011 at Fowlerville, Michigan. A project analyst at Ford Motor Company until his retirement in 1989, Bob was dedicated to the Oak Grove Methodist Church and raising Belted Galloways.

An active member of the Society as well as the Great Lakes Association, Bob showed and exhibited frequently. He earned the nickname "Bullbuster Bob" at the first Wisconsin World Beef show when he slugged his bull Stonecroft Iroquois for head tossing at tie-up time. The bull didn't notice the rap, but Bob broke several bones in his hand. At the emergency room the doctor stared in amusement at his mild-mannered patient, muttering, "Usually this type of break happens in bar fights!"

Kathi Jurkowski was inspired to glue an upside-down bull on top of a trophy and present it to "Bullbuster Bob" at the end-of-show banquet. Bob delighted in the name and the trophy became a coveted award in succeeding years when it was presented to whichever exhibitor had attracted attention for runaway animals or rodeo scenes in the show ring.

Reminders from the CLRC

The Belted Galloway Society, Inc. fee schedule was mailed with the Society dues notices in January. Please note the following requirements to process registrations and transfers in a timely manner:

All orders whether containing 1 transaction or 100 are assessed a \$10 transaction fee.

Please include your transaction fee with your order. A helpful hint: member farms are welcome to batch their transactions with other farms and share the \$10 transaction fee.

Return the Certificate of Registration to Transfer an Animal.

The CLRC requires that during a transfer of an animal to another farm/person, the original Certificate of Purebred Registration/Certificate of Appendix Recordation must accompany the Application for Transfer.

Animals must be tattooed before registering.

The appropriate code is listed in every newsletter.

Expedite your documents.

By faxing your registrations to the CLCR, you can expedite your documents reaching their office by eliminating mailing time. Once your documents have reached the CLRC, normal work flow for processing documents is 5-7 business days in house. Your completed documents will be returned to you via normal mail. Please have your credit card and a completed registration form ready to fax to the CLRC. (Remember to place your credit card information on your completed registration form when faxing.) We encourage members to submit ads the last two weeks of the month. **Advertising bulls ...** Before advertising a young male as a breeder we must be sure he is well conformed, tracks properly, has good legs and feet, and exhibits good weight gains. We should have data available on his birth weight, 205-day weaning weight, and yearling weight. If he's reached breeding age (around 18 months), it's definitely a plus to have his semen checked for quantity and motility.

Any data available should appear in your advertisement along with his birth date and the names of his sire and dam. **Further, it is required that registration numbers be included on bulls advertised for sale in the Hotline and newsletter.**


