We encourage members to submit ads the last two weeks of the month. **Advertising bulls ...** Before advertising a young male as a breeder we must be sure he is well conformed, tracks properly, has good legs and feet, and exhibits good weight gains. We should have data available on his birth weight, 205-day weaning weight, and yearling weight. If he's reached breeding age (around 18 months), it's definitely a plus to have his semen checked for quantity and motility.

Any data available should appear in your advertisement along with his birth date and the names of his sire and dam. **Further, it is required that registration numbers be included on bulls advertised for sale in the Hotline and newsletter.**

Spring Council Meeting

The Spring Council Meeting was called to order on May 1, 2011 at 8 a.m. in Fryeburg, ME by President Ron Howard (ME). Council members present: Jon Bednarski (KY), Leanne Fogle (IL), Scott Griffith (TX), Jerry Moore (KY), Kris von Dorhmann (NH), and Executive Director Vic Eggleston (WI). Absent: Mark Keller (IL), John Rozelle (AZ).

President's Report. Mr. Howard began the meeting with an open forum for members and guests present. President Howard explained that he will be initiating a project to look ahead and establish some goals for the Society for the future five years. Council will be calling upon members, regional groups, or by survey through the newsletter, for their input. Concept discussions followed by members present.

Secretary's Report. Dr. Eggleston accounted current membership as of March 31, 2011: 470 Regular, 73 Junior, 15 Associate, 102 Life, for a total of 660 members. Registrations/transfer transactions for the first quarter of 2011 are 60 Male, 233 Purebred Female, 31 Appendix, 292 Transfers, for a total of 616 transactions.

Treasurer's Report. Dr. Eggleston reported the Society has \$16,116.98 in checking and \$57,231.22 in Savings with Society total assets \$73,348.20.

Annual Meeting. Dr. Eggleston detailed the meeting is scheduled to be held at the Little Everglades Ranch, owned by Bob and Sharon Blanchard, Dade City, FL October 21-23. The Blanchard's operate a purebred and commercial herd of Belted Galloway cattle. Confirmed as the featured speaker for the meeting is Dr. Murray Brilliant (WI), a researcher at Marshfield Laboratory covering pigment patterning genetics.

Beef Technology and Research. President Howard stated the committee is moving ahead and consulting with Dr. Matt Spangler (NE) to be a mentor and advisor for the group.

Budget and Finance. Dr. Eggleston presented the proposed budget. Council commended Dr. Eggleston for his work and voted to accept the budget proposal.

Breed Performance, Measurements and Practices. President Howard reported as a beginning process for breed performance to potentially create a breed performance database, Dr. Eggleston will contact the CLRC regarding their requirements to officially accept and track birth weights. The committee will work to establish educational guidelines for breeders to secure the correct tools and proper protocol to collect birth weight data.

Belted Galloway Foundation. Dr. Eggleston informed Council an update to *The Breeders Manual* will be done in 2011. The Foundation has budgeted \$3,500 for the project. The Belted Galloway Foundation has \$37,638.43 in the General Fund, \$28,087.14 in the Chatfield Scholarship Fund, and \$7,940.69 in the BYG Fund.

Beltie Youth Group. Ms. Fogle reported during the NAILE there were 13 youth and 13 animals that participated in that event. Fogle commended Kaye Weaber (NY) for judging the event. Ron Howard has recruited 8 BYG juniors in Maine who have committed to attending the NAILE Junior show. A Facebook page has been developed for BYG members and new semen has been added to the BYG AI project. The BYG committee recommended to Council changing the current By-Laws to ensure that youth members who are age 21 on January 1 will remain a junior member during the entire calendar year.

Chatfield Scholarship. Ms. von Dorhmann communicated that the Chatfield application deadline has passed. 2011 scholarships will be read and scored within the month. The cookbook project, to help fund the Chatfield Scholarship, is still under way. Currently, there are 75 recipes submitted, however, 200 are needed to publish the project.

Fundraising. President Howard stated that there has been limited fund-raising done in the past few years by The Foundation. The committee is looking ahead at some excellent opportunities that members will want to contribute to by the end of 2011. There have been many discussions to target donations through nutritional analysis, e-communication, and youth programs. It is recommended to continue the (3) \$500 Chatfield scholarships, but undertake a fundraising effort to initiate a larger \$1,500 annual scholarship in addition to the scholarships offered.

Long Range Planning Committee. Dr. Eggleston stated the committee discussed whether to consider closing the Herd book. After considerable discussion, the general consensus was that there was no benefit to closing the Herd book. The question was raised as to why mismarked, purebred animals were put in the appendix recordation rather than being registered, perhaps with a special designation. Jane Faul (KY) was contacted from a historical perspective. Ms. Faul indicated that the precedent had been established early in the rule making of the Society, that only females with minimal white below the dewclaws could be registered. Older Belted Galloway registries established this approach and the founders of the BGS chose to follow the same rules, not only because they agreed with those, but it allowed for greater acceptance of BGS registered animals into other registries.

Promotions/Advertising Committee Meeting. Mr. Bednarski reported on completed projects of the committee. The Belted Galloway Heifer Give-Away through *Grit Magazine* selected a winner. The drawing was done in April and the winner is located in Greenfield, OH. The Society purchased the heifer through the National Sale and she will be delivered to the recipient within the month. 17,000 names were received through the *Grit Magazine* campaign. Another completed campaign, featured the Belted Galloway in the May issue of the *American Cattleman* magazine. The National Sale was also promoted through this venue. Naylor LLC was selected to produce *The Belted Galloway Journal 2011*. Naylor produces around 500 magazines including the *National Cattleman's Magazine*. Bednarski stated all advertising will pay for the magazine. An e-magazine will be produced in addition to the printed version. The membership will receive the first opportunity to advertise, followed by open advertising to

vendors. Journal timeline: the goal is the membership will receive the printed copies in August. Future goals of the committee are acquiring professional photography and initiating membership recruitment and retention in 2012.

Communication, Education and IT. Mr. Griffith explained because of the 17,000 potential email contacts generated by the *Grit* campaign, as well as current membership email addresses on file, the Society has no formal methods for email communication with members or potential members/buyers. Mr. Griffith has talked with a group to initiate a customer database so that the Society could do target marketing by region, as well as, the entire United States. The goal of the committee is to tie the CLRC, regional groups and www.beltie.org to one database. The committee hopes to initiate revenue and use this tool as a communication cost reducer. Ms. Fogle reported the *U.S. Beltie News-Belted Galloway Society, Inc.* has a Facebook page. The newsletter is now posted on beefmagazine.com. The Internet site is the official website of *BEEF Magazine* featuring editorial archives and weekly content.

Executive Committee. President Howard conveyed the committee has continued to work with Dr. Eggleston regarding liability insurance coverage. A future goal for the committee is to develop a clear, concise job description for the Executive Director.

Show/Exhibition Committee. Council determined the Society is responsible for the Kathi Jurkowski National Junior Show in Louisville, KY. Council concluded that the judge for the National Belted Galloway Show in Louisville, KY will not be announced prior to the show. Council appointed Dr. Eggleston to hire the judge for the event. Discussion followed regarding distribution of funds to regional shows. Council tabled discussion to identify goals and objectives for these funds.

The Sale Committee. Mr. Moore reported that the sale committee recommended that The Belted Galloway Premium Sale be held in Louisville in 2011. Council approved the committee's recommendation.

New Business. Greg Hipple (IA) has been appointed to fill the vacant position on Council previously held by Dr. Loren Olson (IA).




