When Sylvia and I visited the Big E back in 2012, we met relative newcomers to the breed and show ring, the Dan and Kirsten Romani family. With their excitement and enthusiasm for Belties, and the fact that they were the inaugural winners of our 2013 calendar contest, I was certain we wanted to visit their farm on our next trip to the Northeast.

Rhode Island, their home state, is small in area but certainly big on beauty. It currently has 13 members and 30 registered cattle. When we arrived at Harmony Meadows Farm, I could see we were in for a history lesson. Dan, who actually is a college history major, works as the business manager at Kirsten's local and growing orthodontic practice. We were greeted by Kirsten Romani and their younger daughter, Ashlyn (9). Dan Romani and children, Daniel (11) and Sophia (13), had left for the 2013 Big E.

Seven years ago the Romanis purchased their historic mid-1800's farm. The existing home's size would not support their growing family. They acquired another historic home 12 miles away and dismantled it. They moved the home and rebuilt it alongside their existing home. The finished and refurbished home, barns and

Oldest Producing Dam Contest



The following day we caught up with the family at the Big E (at right). They were busy washing and clipping their cattle in preparation for the show. By observing them over the next few days, we could see the positive impact that Belted Galloway cattle have on the family.

Chatfield Memorial Scholarship

The A.H. Chatfield Jr., Memorial Scholarship was established by members of the Belted Galloway Society, Inc. in memory of A. H. Chatfield, Jr., of Rockport, ME. Mr. Chatfield's Aldermere Farm provided much of this country's foundational breeding stock. He spent 50 years raising Belted Galloways, preserving and promoting the breed.

It is that time of year to announce the availability of applications for the A. H. Chatfield, Jr., Memorial Scholarships for 2013. Three \$1000 scholarships are awarded annually. The recipients must meet the following criteria:

1. Be a member of the Belted Galloway Junior Association, the Belted Galloway Society Inc., or be a child or grandchild of a BGS member;
2. Be either a graduating high school senior or a college student, or be enrolled in an advanced education program;
3. Submit the completed application form along with a written essay explaining why you are the best possible candidate for the scholarship. Added consideration will be given to applicants enrolled in animal/agriculture-related courses, and those experienced with Belted Galloway cattle. Extracurricular and out-of-school activities will also be taken into consideration.

Greg Hipple and his wife Pat own Sutliff Belties, of Solon, Iowa which is located at the west end of the Historic Sutliff Bridge in Eastern Iowa. Sutliff Belties is a family farming operation consisting of 350 acres of row crops and hay ground, along with a herd of Belted Galloway cattle, and a commercial cow herd. Foundation stock for the Belted Galloway herd is from a few of the oldest herds in the Midwest. The first Beltie was a gift for Pat, which fulfilled a lifelong wish to have some of those Belties "someday". Greg has just completed two terms as a Director with the Great Lakes Belted Galloway Association, four of those serving as Secretary. He has served one term as a member of Council and now is vice-president.

Brice Jackson begins his second term on Council, and has been active on the Show & Sale and Promotions Committees. Brice is Chairman of the Belted Galloway Junior Association. Brice and his family have raised cattle since he was a youngster, first Polled Herefords and later Simmentals, showing nationally for many years. The Jacksons own B&J Cattle Company and live on a farm 30 miles west of Indianapolis, near Greencastle, Indiana. They currently run a herd of 100+ Belted Galloways. They, with the help of their son Jeff, raise and sell Belted Galloway and Simmental cattle, offer hoof trimming services, and sell show supplies, semen and specialty feeds. He is committed both to promoting Beltie cattle and to working with Belted Galloway breeders to increase awareness and enthusiasm for the breed. Brice has been collecting input and information about the benefits of using Belted Galloway cattle both in mainstream cattle operations and show cattle operations.

Show Female of the Year

Countyline Billie Jo 34696B has had an exceptional year starting with several local shows and Regional GLBGA Shows including Belties Unlimited, the Midwest Classic and the Indiana State Fair. After dominating the regional show circuit with 10 Grand Champions, she continued her success for Lillian Ford and her breeders, Jay & Liz Dausman of Indiana, as Reserve Grand Champion Female at the World Beef Expo. Following WBE, HC Sims Farms acquired an interest in her and she went on to be the Kathi Jurkowski National Junior Show Grand Champion Heifer and Reserve National Champion Female in the open show. Billie Jo is a full sister to Countyline Anna, who was the 2012 Honorable Mention Show Heifer of the Year, both sired by Southdown Unique, the 2011 Show Sire of the Year. Billie Jo is now owned in full by HC Sims Farm and has entered their breeding/donor program at their Kentucky Farm.

Show Bull of the Year

Oak Valley Zeus 34647D, bred and owned by Jake and Noah Keller of Durand, IL is the progeny of Platinum Lifetime Female Oak Valley Wendy 30728B, and Platinum Lifetime Bull Wayside Valley Houston 32389D. Zeus and his dam earned the title of Show Cow/Calf of the Year during 2012. Displaying a unique combination of muscle and heavy hindquarters, his 2013 show record includes winning Grand Champion Bull at the following venues: Rock County Preview Show, Belties Unlimited, Winnebago County 4-H Fair and World Beef Expo. He was Reserve Grand Champion Bull at the Midwest Classic and Junior Champion Bull at the National Show. Zeus-sired calves will arrive at Oak Valley Farm in Spring 2014.

Lifetime Dam Sunnybrook Elaine 24684B was past Show Female of the Year. Alexis is remarkable in that she is the only female in the breed to be Show Female of the Year out of a Show Female of the Year and is Honorable Mention for the Dam of the Year title. At six years of age, Alexis easily maintains her soundness and eye appeal. She has transferred these traits to her offspring. All four of her calves have competed at the national level. A son, Sunnybrook Cruise, was honorable mention for Show Bull of the Year. Alexis has also earned Platinum Lifetime status. She is pictured with her calf at side, Sunnybrook Celine, who is sired by the past Show Bull of the Year, Sunnybrook Valor.

Show Sire of the Year

Meadowood Wayland 62W 32119B, was bred by Meadowood Farms LLC in Cazenovia, NY and is owned by Mike Wise in Bluffs, IL. He is sired by Driftwood Revered DP42R 11753B, and is out of Southdown Lilly 8L 18892B. In 2010, after a successful show career, he was the top-selling bull in the Premium Sale at the NAILE and was purchased by Sunnybrook Farms Belvidere, IL. Wayland consistently transferred his thickness and style throughout his first calf crop. His calves were shown successfully in 2012 and were purchased by breeders in eight states. In 2013, the same group of calves had impressive show careers as yearling bulls, steers, and heifers in 18 different venues from coast to coast. He has also earned his Platinum Lifetime merit. His daughter, Sunnybrook Skye, is pictured as Reserve Junior Division Champion at NAILE in 2013 for Julia Weaver and Ellen Sims of Canonsburg, PA.

Show Dam of the Year

Rolling Acres Delores 31318B, sired by Big Rock Periwinkle 7993B, out of Rolling Acres Katheran 30962B, is bred by Vance and Gladys Kincade of Gobles, MI. She was named after their niece, Mother Delores from the Abbey of Regina Laudis in Bethlehem, CT. During 2010, she was one of the first females to arrive at Countyline Belties when Jay and Liz Dausman of Pierceton, IN were beginning to build their herd. She was bred to Southdown Unique producing her first calf, Countyline Anna, who was later named Honorable Mention Show Female of the Year during 2012. In 2013, her second


