BELTED GALLOWAY

TATTOOING YOUR CATTLE

The Society's rules since January, 1996 have required that all Belted Galloways be tattooed in the left ear (or, optionally, both ears) before registration or recordation.

Society members must first record with the registering agency a farm or ranch designation of up to three characters, which may be placed at the beginning or end of a single line tattoo, or may appear in another location in the same ear.

Year of the calf's birth will be designated by an alpha character (M for 2024, N for 2025) and will appear first or last in the tattoo string (at opposite end from farm designation). Up to three numerals shall be placed in the middle of the string.

Some breeders sequentially number their calves beginning each year, others continue the numbering year-to-year. Either way, no two calves may be given identical tattoos.

Your tattoo kit should include a clamp or gun, letters, numbers, bottle of rubbing alcohol, old toothbrush, clean soft rag, preferably green tattoo ink, pair of curved scissors, and a tattoo book or ledger. Disinfect your tattoo set with alcohol or disinfectant between usages to avoid transmitting wart viruses.

To produce a legible tattoo first be sure the calf is held securely then clip the hair inside the ear, clean away wax with a soft cloth dampened with rubbing alcohol. Apply tattoo ink before clamping the tattoo gun firmly into the inner area of the ear in the upper or middle lobe. Immediately after releasing the clamp, rub ink generously into the impressions with an old toothbrush. Ink is available in bottles or tubes, and generally is black or green. Green is recommended for Belted Galloways.

PERCENTAGE BELTED GALLOWAYS

The inclusion of percentage animals in the Belted Galloway breed registry serves both a protective and progressive role in maintaining breed purity while supporting breed growth. Here are some key points on how percentage Belted Galloways can support our breed.

1. Expanding the Genetic Base While Maintaining Breed Standards. The limited population of purebred Belted Galloways means genetic diversity can be a challenge. By allowing percentage animals the gene pool is carefully expanded. Offspring from percentage programs can be bred back to purebreds, ensuring the long-term integrity of the breed.

2. Preventing Inbreeding & Genetic Bottlenecks. A small genetic pool increases the risk of inbreeding, leading to potential health and fertility issues. Percentage breeding introduces new but compatible genetics, helping maintain herd health and productivity.

3. Providing an Entry Point for New Breeders. Allowing percentage animals makes the breed more accessible to those starting in Belted Galloway breeding.. This encourages more farmers and ranchers to invest in the breed, increasing overall numbers and recognition.

4. Strengthening Commercial Viability. Farmers who want Belted Galloway traits—such as lean, flavorful beef and hardiness—but

also need commercial adaptability can use percentage animals to improve hybrid vigor. This helps expand the market for Belted Galloway genetics, keeping the breed relevant in modern agriculture.

5. Maintaining Breed Integrity Through Upgrading Programs. Many breed associations have upgrading programs, allowing percentage animals to be bred up to purebred status over several generations. This ensures that while genetic expansion occurs, the core Belted Galloway traits are preserved.

6. Increasing Demand & Breed Awareness. The ability to register percentage animals attracts more breeders and encourages crossbreeding programs that highlight the Beltie's strengths. This ultimately leads to greater interest in the breed, further securing its future.

Rather than compromising the purity of the Belted Galloway breed, percentage animals serve as a controlled method of strengthening and preserving it. The careful integration of percentage animals ensures that breed integrity remains intact, while also expanding its reach and improving its genetic foundation.

MEMBERSHIP SPOTLIGHT

Bohnet Red Belted Galloways

Nestled in the plains of South Dakota, Bohnet Red Belted Galloway Ranch stands as a testament to a lifelong passion for livestock and an unwavering commitment to Red Belted Galloway cattle. Owner and founder, Marv Bohnet has built the world's largest registered herd of exclusively Red Belted Galloway cattle, a journey marked by resilience, dedication, and a love for cattle that began in the heart of North Dakota.

A Farm Boy's Roots

Born on a North Dakota farm, Marv Bohnet was surrounded by Herefords, Holsteins, sheep, pigs, and chickens. Life took an unexpected turn when his father passed away in a car accident, leaving his mother to manage the farm with three young children. Eventually, the farm was sold, but the 'livestock bug' never left him.

His path led him to college, then to serve in the prestigious Old Guard, the ceremonial unit of the U.S. Army. After completing his service, he finished his college education and embarked on a 32-year career in teaching and coaching. Yet, cattle remained a constant in his life.

The Birth of MRB Cattle

In 1982, a friend introduced him to registered polled Herefords, and from there, his cattle operation began

to flourish. Arabian horses and a few cattle graced his pastures, but his curiosity was piqued by the Belted Galloway breed—specifically the striking red variety. “Red and white has always been my favorite color for cattle,” he recalls. “The white belt around the belly made them unique.”

Before the internet, finding Red Belted Galloways was no small feat. Through persistence, he eventually connected with Keith Jones of Driftwood Plantation in South Carolina and purchased five head, including Driftwood Kendra 47S, a cow that would become the cornerstone of his herd.



Combining his teaching and coaching career with cattle ranching, he adopted the prefix 'MRB' (MR. B) for his herd. His operation expanded through artificial insemination, embryo transfer, and selective breeding, often using his polled Hereford heifers as recipients for Red Beltie embryos. Today, Bohnet Red Belted Galloway Ranch is home to about 65 head, with a springtime expansion of 35 calves.

A Vision for Quality and Temperament

For Marv, the ideal Belted Galloway is more than just appearance. "Temperament is number one in my book," he explains. "Then I look for structure and a good-looking animal for the breed." His selective breeding approach is evidenced by the fact that out of 15 bull calves born last year, only six were kept as breeding bulls, with the rest steered.

The ranch's management practices reflect Marv's practical experience and commitment to cattle welfare. His cattle graze in four pastures with access to mineral tubs and salt blocks, and calves are introduced to creep feeders early, making weaning a smooth transition.

Marketing and Sales: Sharing the Red Beltie Legacy

Bohnet Red Belted Galloway Ranch offers both high-quality beef directly to consumers and breeding stock to

fellow Belted Galloway enthusiasts. The ranch has built a reputation for delivering exceptional beef, with many satisfied customers returning for more. "I've given away a lot of beef, and I've never had anyone not like it," he shares.

Additionally, Marv sells both male and female cattle to other breeders, contributing to the growth and improvement of the Belted Galloway breed. The ranch's genetics are sought after, and its influence can be seen in herds across the country.

The ranch has also made history, with a young 4-H member showing the first Red Belted Galloway steer at the South Dakota State Fair. "People stop by to take pictures because they've never seen red ones before," he shares. His response to curious visitors is always simple and true: "The difference is just the color."

Bohnet Red Belted Galloway Ranch is more than a business; it is the realization of a lifelong dream. Through a blend of hard work, persistence, and a deep understanding of cattle, Marv Bohnet has cultivated a herd that is as unique as it is impressive. His story is a shining example of what passion and perseverance can achieve within the Belted Galloway community.

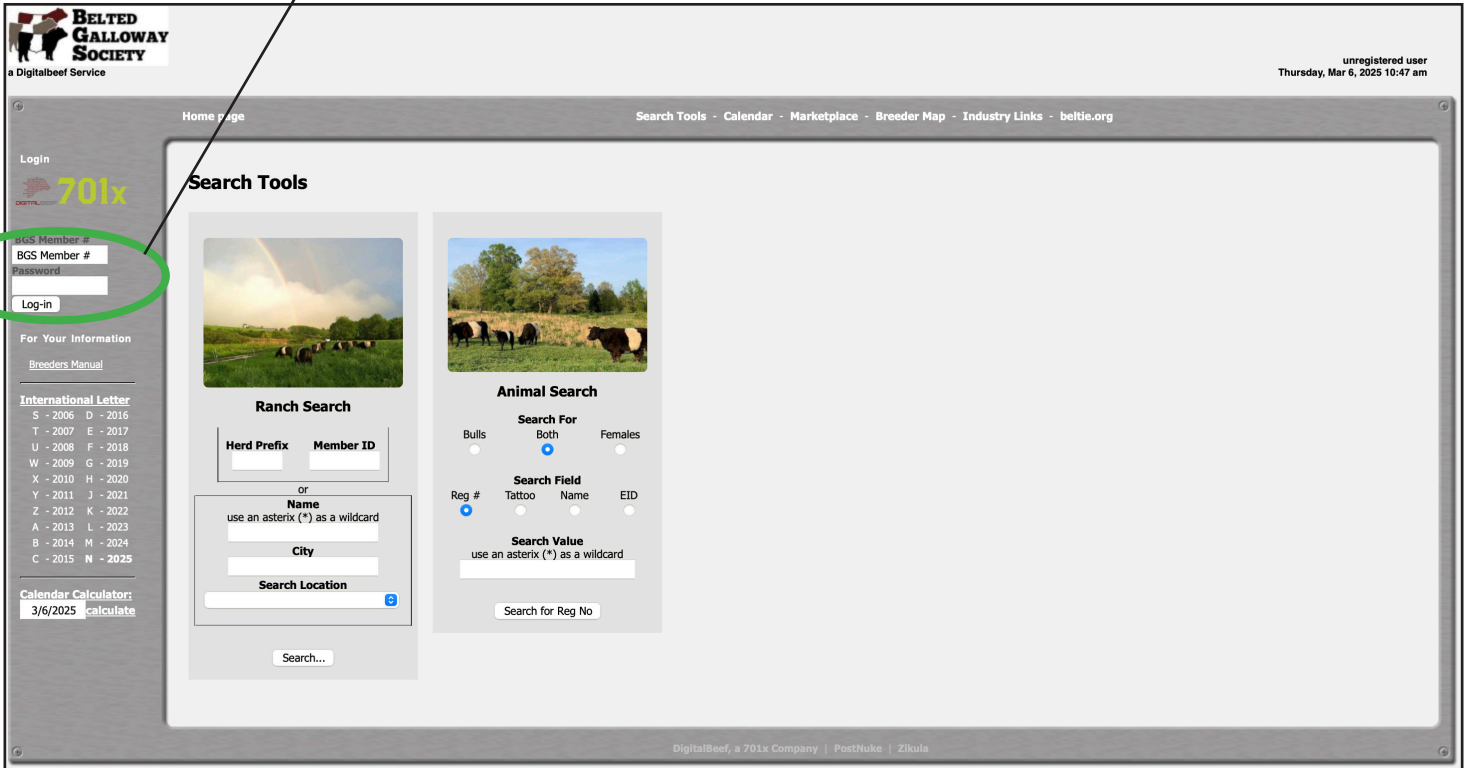

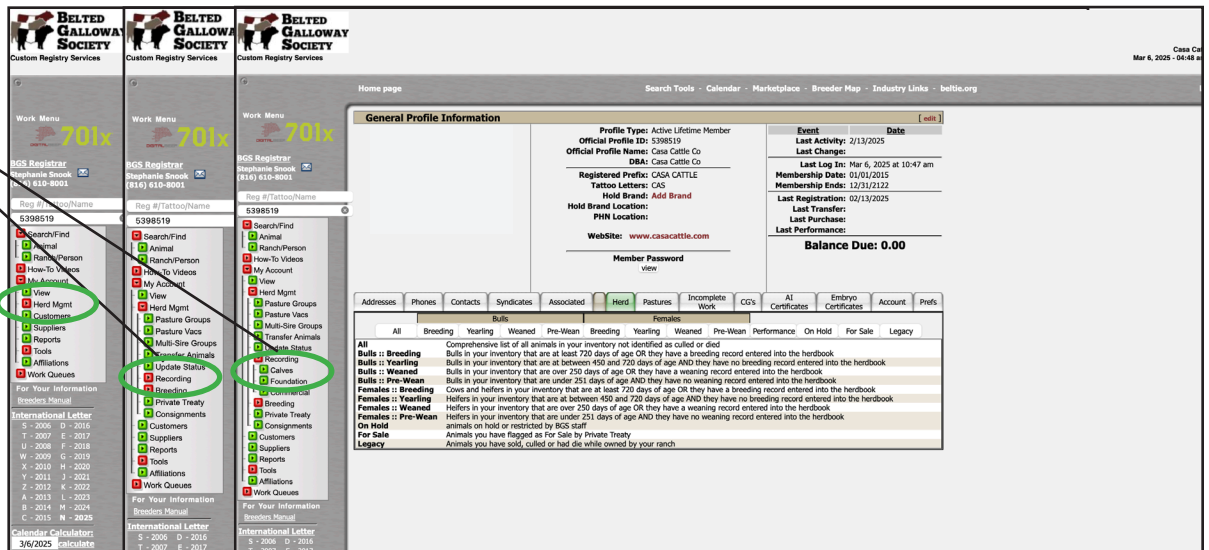

To log into the online Breed Registry system, go to beltedgalloway.digitalbeef.com or go to beltie.org and click on the Online Breed Registry link. Enter your username (member number) and password. Your password was sent to you via email when the transition began and your dues were current. If you do not know your username or password or do not currently have an online account set up, please email executivedirector.bgs@gmail.com.

Once you have logged in, use the navigation menu on the left to click on Herd Management and then click on Recording and Calves. Please note buttons in red can be expanded and have additional options below.

3 Fill in the desired birth information for the calves you would like to record. For a brief explanation of each column heading click page guide on the top right corner of the screen. If you do not wish to register your animal and only record it for performance purposes uncheck the Register box. Unregistered animals can be registered at a later date.

After initial Validation, records are color-coded to show the selected birth season. Each have a different color so you can easily see which calves are set to be grouped together.

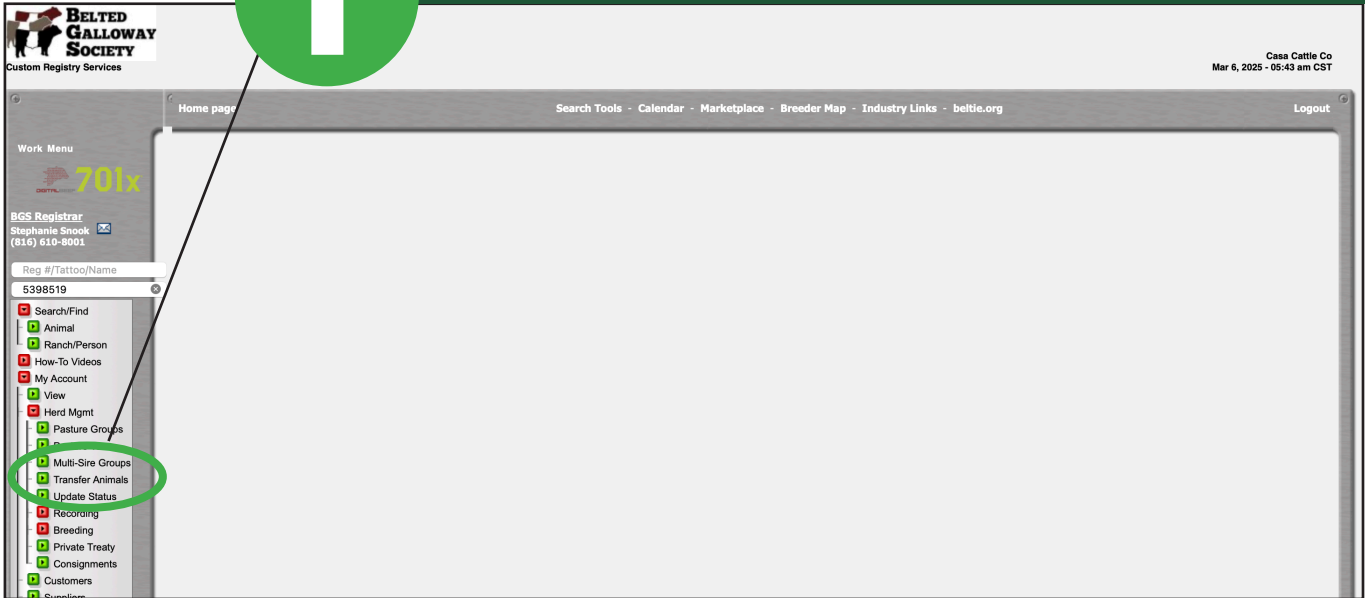

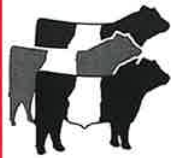

MORE HELPFUL TIPS & INFORMATION

- When conducting a transfer of an animal the certificate of registration or recordation must be surrendered. This can be done in 2 ways; mail the certificate to the registrar's office OR write the word void on over the front of the certificate and scan and email it to the registrar's office.
- DNA requests are now being done on Digital Beef. DNA requests can be requested when the animal is being registered. If you have already registered an animal and would like a DNA and/or Hypo test kit that is also requested through Digital Beef under the DNA tab for the animal. There is a how-to video for this topic as well in Digital Beef. A reminder that kits are still emailed to the email on file BUT only after the kit has been paid for.
- Started some work and had to leave? The great thing about Digital Beef is that you can do your work in one sitting or over some time....but don't use too much time! Any work in your account that has not been paid for in 45 days will be canceled. You will be able to start again but your prior unpaid for work will not be there.
- Using a commercial animal? Then let's add it to your herd. Digital Beef offers the opportunity to add commercial animals to your herd list. Using a registered animal from another breed? Then let's add it to your herd. Digital Beef offers the opportunity to add "Foundation" animals to your herd list. Reach out to our Registrar to see how!
- Sold an animal to a non-member? Want them to get the certificate? We can do that! Fill out a paper transfer form and make note that the transfer is to a non-member and the Registrar will reach out to them!
- Sell an animal to a non-member? Let us know and we can reach out to give them a discounted offer for membership! Non-members have 60- days to take advantage of this offer and become part of the Belted Galloway Society!
- Effective July 1st, 2025 memberships lapsed by more than 1 year will see an increased fee to renew their membership. The fee will go from \$80 to \$120.

Adequate body condition at the time of calving for young females and mature cows is important as it impacts stamina during delivery of the calf, colostrum quality, calf vigor, and also impacts subsequent rebreeding. Adequate nutrition during the last trimester of pregnancy and especially the last 50-60 days prior to calving is important. Two-year-old heifers and three-year-old cows are vulnerable during this time period. These young females are still growing themselves while growing a calf inside them. As this calf grows and takes up room, rumen capacity is impacted and the amount of feed the young female can eat is reduced. Body condition can deteriorate rapidly under these conditions.

2. Review with your veterinarian your herd health plan. The whole production system should be discussed identifying critical control points where management could reduce risk and cost effectively improves herd health. Specifically address management options to mitigate health problems that have historically been an issue.

3. Examine calving facilities making sure they are in good working order. Frequently it has been 9-10 months since calving facilities have been used. Inspect gates, pens, alleys and head catches, fixing or replacing broken items. Give pens and facilities a good cleaning and disinfecting before calving starts if it wasn't done at the end of the season last year. Good lighting is an important part of a calving facility. Check lights and have replacement bulbs on hand.

4. Check your calving supplies and review the stages of parturition (calving) to understand when assistance is needed. Make sure you have on hand plastic sleeves, obstetrical lube, obstetrical chains or straps, esophageal feeders and calf feeding bottles. Test flashlights or spotlights to make sure they are working as well. Inventory halters, ropes, and other tools that may be needed. Make sure the fetal extractor (calf puller) is clean and working properly.

5. Have colostrum or colostrum replacement products on hand. Quality colostrum consumption by the calf shortly after birth is foundational for the health of the calf throughout its life. The calf's ability for absorption of immunoglobulin across the intestine decreases rapidly 6-12 hours after birth. Therefore, it is critical that the calf receives colostrum soon after birth. It is a good practice to immediately milk out a heifer or cow when she is assisted at calving and provide this colostrum to the calf. Calves experiencing a difficult delivery are less likely to nurse in a timely way and will benefit from receiving colostrum shortly after birth via a bottle or esophageal feeder.

6. Have a plan and equipment for warming calves if calving during cold weather. Calves born during cold, wet conditions can quickly succumb to hypothermia. Have facilities, tools and supplies on hand to deal with this type of event. For mild hypothermia, (body temperature between 94 and 100°F) giving a calf warm, body temperature colostrum or colostrum replacement products along with drying the calf off with towels and warm air can quickly bring a calf's temperature back to normal. For extreme hypothermia, a combination of warm colostrum with a warm bath can be used. Calves should be dry, alert and have a normal body temperature before being returned to their mother.

7. Plan to provide wind protection along with a clean, dry environment. Wet, muddy conditions are stressful both to cows and calves. This kind of environment also provides a situation where disease proliferation is more likely to occur. When possible, providing a clean, dry place for calves and cows to lay down will reduce stress and promote calf health.

MANAGING KEY INVESTMENTS

THE BEEF HERD SIRE

Warm spring rains and the smell of summer are floating about the country and the minds of many beef producers have turned to bull turn out. Making sure that bulls are ready to service cows and move the next calf crop forward is something that should not be a last-minute thought! In beef herds, about 90% of the cows are impregnated by natural service sires each year. The herd sire is such an important part of the success of a cow-calf operation that great care should be given to his selection and care.

In this article, I will put forward some considerations for your bull leading up to and including the current breeding season. However, managing the bull's health and productivity is a year-long process that is often not able to be corrected overnight if mismanaged. Spermatogenesis is the production and development of sperm and is a 60-day process. In other words, the sperm that hopefully settles the first cow of the breeding season was created two months ago... Were you focused on your bull two months ago?

Nutrition is a key factor in bull care. Bulls need to be in proper body condition at the start of the breeding season, which is

a 5.5 to 6.5 Body Condition Score on a 9-point scale. Bulls that are over-conditioned or under-conditioned may fail in the breeding pasture.

Young bulls that have been developed on high-energy diets and are over-conditioned need to be "let down" slowly and have their diets switched to a more forage-based ration for at least 30 days prior to turn out. Bulls that are over-conditioned at the beginning of breeding season often experience dramatic weight loss that can affect fertility, endurance, and even interest in servicing females. Bulls do need to be fed in the off season so that they are in good body condition and proper mineral status well in advance of being turned out. Regaining condition is especially important after a yearling bull's first season as he will continue to grow to reach his proper mature weight.

Exercise also plays a role in the endurance and mating ability of a bull. Make sure that your herd sire is sound on his feet and legs and has been housed so that he receives daily exercise. Bulls should not be taken straight from being housed in a barn or small lot and be turned out

and expected to cover large pastures. Bulls need to have a proper period to exercise and be able to tone up before heavy service.

Bulls should be included in your operation's normal health programs, such as vaccinations and deworming. These practices need to be performed well in advance of the breeding season. Specific protocols should be developed with your veterinarian and will be focused on the challenges of your area and operation.

Body Condition Scoring and evaluation of feet and legs help us to evaluate the bull from a physical standpoint; however, to increase the true success of the bull's ability to complete his duties, we should also complete a Breeding Soundness Exam on bulls each year. Yearly Breeding Soundness Exams (BSE) should be conducted before the breeding season so that a producer has the time to correct issues or replace the bull if issues are found. A bull's breeding ability can change from one year to the next and even within a breeding season, so annual evaluation is important. It is also important to observe the bull throughout the breeding season because injuries can occur that would hinder his ability to settle cows.

Several factors go into a BSE and all of them play an important part in the bull's ability. Exams are broken into three basic areas:

Physical Examination – feet, legs, eyes, sheath, and overall structural condition

Reproductive Examination – internal and external sex organs, scrotal circumference

Semen Collection and Examination – at least 30% Motility and 70% morphology

Briefly, for example, there are minimum Scrotal Circumferences (SC) for different ages of bulls (Table 1). Scrotal Circumference not only plays a role in fertility, but research has also shown that bulls with larger scrotal measurements produce daughters that tend to reach puberty earlier and are more fertile.

Table 1: Minimum Scrotal Circumference requirements based on bull's age.

AGE IN MONTHS	<15	15-18	18-21	21-24	>24
SC IN cm	30	31	32	33	34

Libido is something that is not evaluated in a Breeding Soundness Exam but is extremely important to a successful breeding season! You should make sure that you take the time to watch your bull once he is turned out to ensure he is finding and servicing cows that are in heat. Mark a few dates

down as to when certain cows could be coming back into heat and watch to make sure a large number are not re-cycling. Bulls can lose their libido because of injury, extremely heavy service, or competition with other bulls. If you are running multiple bulls in a pasture, it is best to put bulls of similar age and disposition out together so that the odds of heavy fighting and injury decrease.

Heavy service may be determined by the bull to cow ration. Several factors should go into decisions on what your bull to cow ratio should be for a controlled breeding season. Things such as pasture size and terrain, time of the year, if synchronization and AI breeding were used, and age of the bull

The old rule of thumb is a bull in proper condition and soundness should be able to cover one female for each month of age (Table 2). But, there are several factors mentioned already that can change that number.

Table 2: Bull to cow ratio recommendations for a 65-day breeding season.

BULL AGE	# OF FEMALES
12-18 months	10-15
19-23 months	15-20
24-29 months	20-25
30 months or older	25-35

Bulls will be the main source of genetic improvement in a cow herd and often are a large investment. Producers should make sure that this key investment has every opportunity to work! Successful breeding seasons are based on many factors that are influenced by the management of the cowherd and of the herd sire. Operations need to make sure that every effort has been made to manage the herd sire for a successful breeding season. Think about year-long care, health programs, nutrition, and Breeding Soundness Exams so that your bull performs well on day one of your breeding season.

Breeder of the Year - Sunnybrook Farms

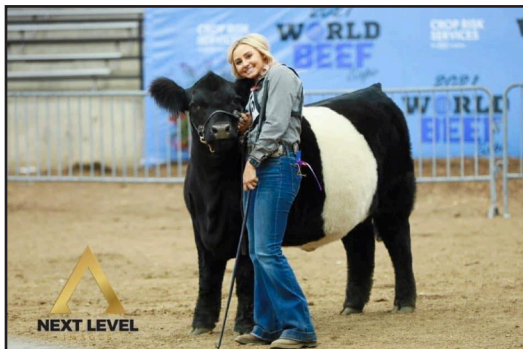


Sunnybrook Farms is located in Belvidere, IL and owned by Terry, Julie, Chris (Cody), and Steve (Kaitlyn) Willis. Sunnybrook Farms is humbled and proud to be named the 2024 Breeder of the Year. Sunnybrook Farms can now claim genetics in all 50 states and Canada. The cattle at Sunnybrook Farms are not traditional Belted Galloway genetics; they are specifically designed for today's beef industry. In 2001, Belted Galloways were introduced to the farm and integrated with the high-quality Angus herd. These cattle were required to meet the same rigorous standards set for the Angus. When the Angus herd was eventually dispersed, the farm significantly reduced feed requirements, cutting grain usage and lowering the amount of land dedicated to hay and pasture by 40%.

The cattle at Sunnybrook Farms are moderate in size, with superior thickness, sound feet, legs, and bone, and are capable of thriving on a higher roughage diet. These traits are considered essential for the herd. The cows are bred for longevity, remaining productive in the herd for 12 to 20 years. Emphasis is placed on temperament, sound udders, and structural integrity. All bulls must pass a Breeding Soundness Exam (BSE) with a strong focus on testicular development and semen morphology before being sold. Steers are expected to produce high-quality carcasses with above-average rates of gain, all while being maintained on a high roughage diet. The goal is to harvest steers at 15-18 months of age, with carcass data consistently collected and analyzed, showing remarkable uniformity.

The objective at Sunnybrook Farms is to produce cattle that can successfully compete in the show ring while excelling in real-world performance. Bulls must meet strict selection criteria before being considered for breeding. The farm does not breed show cattle—rather, it showcases breeding cattle. Participating in cattle shows provides an opportunity for their stock to be evaluated by some of the top all-breed cattle producers in the industry. Above all, the cattle must perform efficiently in pasture conditions while also meeting the scrutiny of expert judges. Sunnybrook Farms takes great pride in its elite herd of Belted Galloway cattle and the strong community surrounding this remarkable breed.

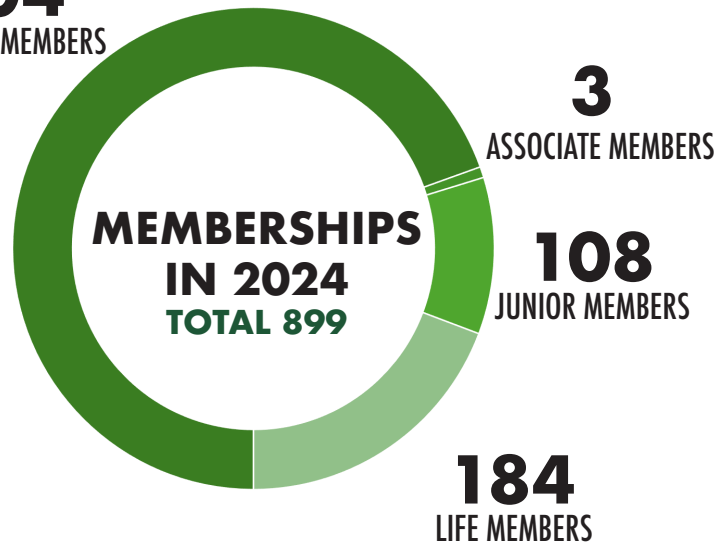


ANIMALS REGISTERED BY BREEDING MODE IN 2024



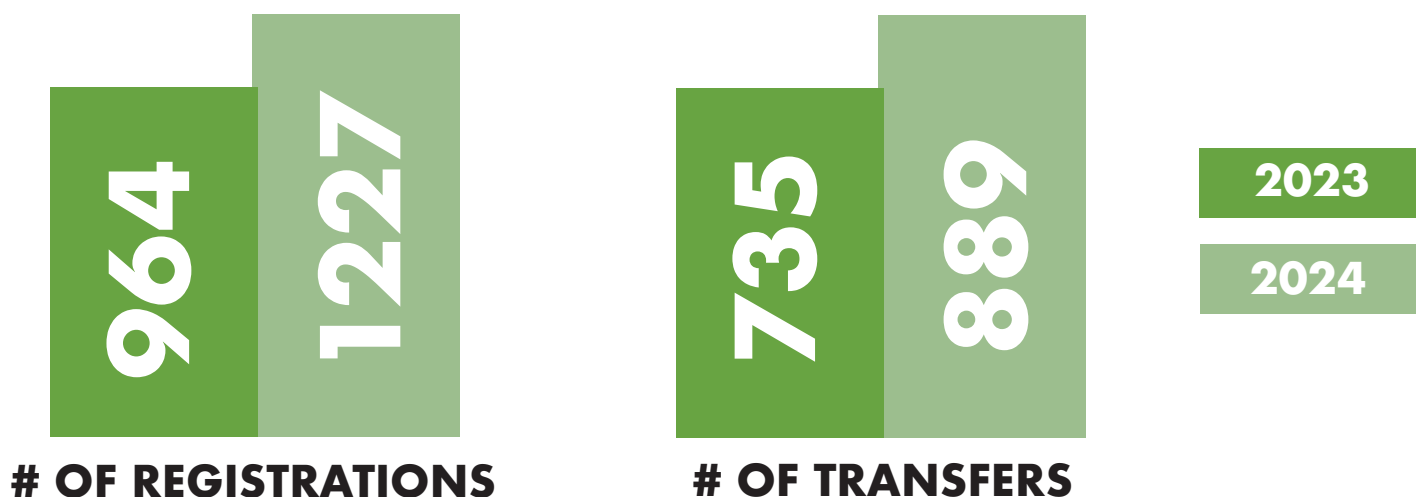
