




Crown H Cattle earned its name as a combination of the historic cattle ranch with a modern twist. "H Cattle" comes from the Hanna Brothers Ranch registered brand. The preceding "Crown" comes from the meaning of Regina's name - queen.

"WE LOVE RAISING OUR TWO KIDS ON THE FAMILY RANCH."

In the early 1940s, Judd's grandmother, Elinore Hanna, packed up her two boys and left Southern California for the North State. During her trip North, she struck up a conversation with a fellow diner who suggested they check out Scott Valley. A few days later they pulled into Etna, California, immediately fell in love with the area, and bought a beautiful piece of property in the mountains. With a childhood that closely resembled the stereotypical "wild west," Judd's dad and uncle grew up breaking horses, raising cattle and sheep, and putting up hay - all with no electricity or running water for years.

After high school, both Hanna brothers left their hometown to attend Oregon State University after which they (both) served in the military before deciding to return to their family ranch property in Scott Valley to put down roots. They traded some property for cattle, bought more land, and started families of their own while ranching together as Hanna Brothers Ranch. The rest they say is history.

Today, the Hanna Brothers Ranch raises commercial and registered Angus cattle, and puts up alfalfa, grain, and grass hay. Judd (who is one of the Hanna brothers) met Regina in college and were married on the ranch more than 20 years ago. They absolutely love raising their two kids (among other animals) on the family ranch. Regina learned all about cattle and eventually fell in love with the Belted Galloway breed.



CROWN H CATTLE


A Select Sires A.I. Specialist, who is also a family friend, helped inspire a new herd of cattle on the Hanna Brothers Ranch. In 2018, this friend let Judd and Regina know about an opportunity to re-home a Beltie calf, Sammi, who lived 6 hours away on the Oregon Coast.


"Sammi the Beltie" joined the Hanna family and their Angus/Commercial herd cattle ranch. Regina and Judd decided to start a collection of heritage Belted Galloway Cattle to sell direct-to-consumer in 2018 as Crown H Cattle Company. The Crown H Brand is a blend of the Hanna Bros Ranch brand and the meaning of Regina's name - queen.

As an animal lover who likes learning about breeds (you name it, cats, horses, chicken, etc.), Regina always enjoys researching new animals. "On road trips, I would see "ringed cattle" in California, Oregon, and Tennessee and began to learn about Belted Galloways." Regina said. "And, soon Belties popped up in my reading about history - Winston Churchill (he owned a herd that he loved.)"

Regina has slowly grown her herd with the goal of having a cow-calf operation. She has bought bred heifers from California (Ravenwood Farm and Stewart Ranch) and Oregon. They also have been artificially inseminating twice a year. Judd has been a rancher all of his life so his knowledge of beef and hay production has benefited Crown H Cattle Company. Their Belties are fed both alfalfa and grass hay they grow and steers are finished with a custom barley mix. They haul their steers to a local USDA processor and their beef is dry-aged for at least 14 days.









presence of Crown H Cattle Company has been a challenge for their operation as they acknowledge they did not have graphic design, website building experience or much of a marketing budget.

"I had to do much of it myself - creating my Squarespace website and my ecommerce site on Shopify. I did get help from two of my former students to help make my website look more polished and pleasing to the eye - many thanks to @lefthook.design and @circlebarco. From the business aspect, my local economic development council (@siskiyouedc) and mastermind group (@M5entrepreneurs) have been very influential in my education on how to run my business." The Hannas started selling shares of beef on their website in 2021 and then moved to selling cuts of beef in early 2022. They ship across the United States and also have pick up/local delivery options.

Judd and Regina's two kids, Dylan (15 yrs) and Grady (13 yrs), are great ranchhands especially when working and moving cattle. Dylan works on the ranch during the summer, irrigating and baling hay, fixing fences, and hauling equipment. She has been training two heifers, an Angus to sell at the auction and a Beltie to show at their county fair this year. This will be the first time a Belted Galloway has been to our Siskiyou Golden Fair.

In their free time, the Hanna Family enjoys exploring the beautiful wilderness around them on foot and horseback, adventuring in Baja, Mexico, as well as drinking and learning about all kinds of wines.



2021 BREEDER & EXHIBITOR OF THE YEAR



Sunnybrook Farms is located in Belvidere, Illinois and owned by Terry, Julie, Chris & Steve Willis.

This year we are extremely humbled and proud to announce we have genetics in all 50 states. The farm is based around 25 proven Belted Galloway females. Most people may not realize what it takes to be named breeder and exhibitor of the year. It takes A LOT of hard work and proven genetics. Compared to the main stream breeds, the Belted Galloway breed has a low genetic diversity, making it nearly impossible to find a volume of structurally correct females and even harder to find out cross bulls to breed them to. Somehow the right bull always seems to magically appear!

One of our major goals is to produce cattle that are consistent in good structure and thickness to help improve the Belted Galloway breed. We are extremely proud to see those traits repeating over the generations of cattle we breed.

The cows have to be bred, calved, and sheared for summer heat due to a lack of shade. The calves need to be clipped, broke, and weaned. They need to be fed properly and developed, the hair worked and clipped, taught to show, hauled, exhibited, and merchandised. Sunnybrook Farms has implemented the use of production records, DNA trait identification, and carcass results from ultrasound and slaughter data, and added IVF to further the predictability of the offspring produced in the herd. We raise and bale our own hay. We supplement the pasture and hay with corn silage during the winter and use rolled ear corn to finish the steers. We feed corn stalk bales in the winter and use them with straw for bedding. All the round bales of hay and most of the corn stalk bales are wrapped in plastic to protect them and prevent spoilage. Not to mention all the manure that has to be hauled and winter snow that needs to be moved out of the lots to keep the cattle clean.

FEMALE OF THE YEAR

Sunnybrook Java, 45697B was bred by Sunnybrook Farms, Terry and Julie Willis, Belvidere, IL. Java is owned and shown by Maddey Tebbe, Pocahontas, IL. Her sire is HCS Flannagan, Platinum Award Winner and Runner Up Sire of the Year in 2021. Her dam is Platinum Award Winner Sunnybrook Jade, 2-time Cow-Calf of the Year with Java (2020) and Jewel (2021) at her side. Java was at the side of her dam Sunnybrook Jade who was named Miss World Galloway 2020. Java was named Miss World Galloway 2020. Java was named Miss World Galloway 2021. She is Maddey's first Belted Galloway and they have become the best of friends! Java has been in the spotlight since she was a calf. Keeping her in the spotlight, Maddey and Java's big wins were Grand Champion Heifer at the Midwest Classic, World Beef Expo, and the National Show at NAILE, along with multiple AOB wins at county fairs.

BULL OF THE YEAR

Moonshadow Roman 46875B was bred and owned by Scot & Christine Adams of Starks, ME. His sire is the 2013 Fryeburg Fair Supreme Champion Holbrook Hill Zulu Warrior III. His dam is Anderson Hill Moscow, she is out of the multiple time champion Anderson Hill Bop Man. Both his sire and grandsire are Platinum Achievement Bulls with many champion offspring to their credit. Roman is structurally correct, heavily muscled, powerhouse of a bull with the eye appeal on the profile to make him easily rise to the top in the show ring. He was named Supreme Champion Bull in 2021 at Skowhegan, Union, and Fryeburg Fairs. Congratulations to Colby Woods Cattle for being the new owners of this outstanding bull.



DAM OF THE YEAR




SIRE OF THE YEAR

Countyline Connor, 37033B has surpassed the success of his parents, Southdown Unique, Rolling Acres Deloris, and his 2 full sisters who were all past national point show winners. He was bred by Jay and Liz Dausman, Pierceton, IN and is owned by Sunnybrook Farms, Belvidere, IL. Connor is the only bull to receive Show Bull, Sire a Show Bull of the Year and two Show Females of the year, plus 5- time Sire of the Year and Runner Up Sire of the Year in 2020 with just 6 calf crops. His bone, thickness, and style are easily recognizable in his progeny. In 2021 his progeny and grand progeny continued to dominate at all the major shows attended. Connor's daughters are producing offspring that are being extremely successful at all the major shows. His progeny are also excelling in carcass quality based on ultrasound data collected and actual data on harvested steers. Connor's daughters are crossing really well with our other herd sire, HCS Flannagan, who was runner up Sire of the Year.

COW/CALF OF THE YEAR

Sunnybrook Jade, 39401B, is bred and owned by Sunnybrook Farms Belvidere, IL. She is a platinum lifetime award winner and her pedigree contains many Platinum Award Winners. She was the first daughter born out of 5-time Sire of the Year, Countyline Connor. Her dam (Sunnybrook Jackie) and granddam (Southdown Sophie) have both been Dam of the Year winners. Jade has been in the spotlight since she was a calf. Jade and her calf, Jewel have been champions at several shows in 2021. At the same time her 2020 calf, Java, was show female of the year and recently named Miss World Galloway 2021. The judges have always commented how competitive she would be against any breed. Both Tipton, IA natives, Michael and Kathleen Wagner are the owners of Wagner Farms. The Wagners are a blended family with seven children and their youngest, Audrey, is the reason they own Belted Galloway Cattle today.

In 2007, Audrey raised Belted Galloway Cattle as a part of her 4H project. But, when it was time for Audrey to go to college, Kathy decided to add a few of her own to the herd since she was going to be doing cow chores anyways. Mike and Kathy bought their first Belted Galloway in 2011 who is still a part of the herd today.

Mike and Kathy live on Mike's family's farm which includes about 1200 acres of tillable land, 135 acres of hay ground and, in combination with Audrey's herd, 50 head of purebred registered Belted Galloway Cattle. Kathy admits that they may have started with Belted Galloway cattle because they are cute, but clarifies that they are so passionate about the breed because of the characteristics that have set them apart from others such as their disposition, their quality of meat, ease of feeding and durability in adverse weather conditions.



WAGNER FARMS

Wagner Farms runs two breeding cycles (Spring and Fall). Their females are raised for their phenotypic and genotypic qualities and are sold as both breeding cattle and show animals. "Show cattle should also be breeding cattle." says Kathy. "They must be able to do both for the longevity of our herd and the Belted Galloway breed."

Males who are born on Wagner Farms are evaluated for quality and either kept intact for breeding pieces or castrated and fed for beef products. The intact bulls are either sold to other breeders or kept and integrated into their own herd. Wagner Farms sells grain fed beef in wholes, halves, and quarters to their local community as freezer beef.

The Wagners are members of their Regional and National Belted Galloway Associations and continue to be involved in youth programs and benefits to continue to grow breed participation.

The Wagners are passionate about the Beltie Youth and donate handmade items each year to the silent auction that benefits the Beltie Junior Program.

"We enjoy helping people get started in the breed." says Kathy. "From learning how to feed their animals, care for their animals or register their animals, we like to follow our customers through the process to make sure they have a good experience." The Wagners believe that the Belted Galloway breed can continue to grow if new members are guided and encouraged along the way.

When they can find some free time in their busy schedules, the Wagners spend time in their garden where they raise most of their vegetables. Kathy loves making quilts and is a church organist/pianist when she can. Mike has a Harley Davidson motorcycle that he loves to ride when he gets the chance to.




Ashton Caron


TOP 10 SIRES OF ALL TIME

JOURNAL REPORT



Greg HippleExecutive Director

The members of the Belted Galloway Society, as well as the rest of the world continue to recover from what arguably is the broadest ranging and life altering event of many of our lives, the COVID-19 pandemic.

Although the higher market prices for our cattle and greatly improved demand for high quality breeding stock and beef have been enjoyed by all, the ever-increasing costs associated with the cattle industry keep us all grounded in reality.

This was a busy year. Our first and only Executive Director, Vic Eggleston, announced his retirement in January. Vic had served as the face of our Society since 2010. His contributions to the breed and to the membership are invaluable.

A glitch was discovered at CLRC where membership dues notices were not sent out. Vic spent many hours conducting mailings to lapsed memberships during the time the council was searching for our second Executive Director.

The economics of the real world forced the Society to re-evaluate the fee schedule for the first time in over 11 years. This need was brought about by an accumulation of several factors including, the increased fees to handle all aspects of registering, recording, and transferring cattle, to the cost of business regarding beltie.org, maintaining the technology needed to accommodate the Society's needs, increased costs for printings and mailings, plus the addition of a new contractor to satisfy the desires of the membership for increased promotion and outreach.

Corinna Caron (ME) was hired by your Council in June of 2022 as the first Coordinator of Breed Promotion and Member Outreach.

Total charges for services to the Society by CLRC have increased \$30,271.23 from our first contract in 2010 through December 31, 2021. Per unit fees, the fees charged for each unit of work performed at the CLRC have increased from \$5.55 / unit to \$8.15 / unit. During this time the membership numbers have increased by over 200, and the animals registered or recorded, have increased by over 400.

The Society has been absorbing many affiliated costs charged by the CLRC for various aspects of registration updates and additional mailings that are required when transferring upon registration. With this being said, the Council voted in April to make the first increases in fees in over a decade to help defray some of these costs, while leaving the fees for registrations, and transfers alone, plus removing and incorporating the \$10 handling fee charges to each member by the CLRC. Effective January 1, 2023 a new fee schedule will apply. Please make sure to use the current fee schedule when ordering services from the CLRC. It is available in the US Beltie News and on beltie.org.

The total number of registered Belted Galloway cattle in the US for the year 2021 is 21,735. Texas leads the states in numbers followed by New York, Wisconsin, Maine, and Indiana.

Next on the order of business is updating handouts and literature. This will be undertaken in the not so distant future.

The contractors that serve the Belted Galloway Society are very appreciative of the support of the membership. The Council members and contractors are available to offer help and assistance to all who have an interest in the breed.

CANADIAN LIVESTOCK RECORDS CORPORATION

The Canadian Livestock Records Corporation (CLRC) is a non-profit corporation, established under Canadian federal legislation, The Animal Pedigree Act, to provide registry services to incorporated breed associations. The CLRC acts as a neutral third party between the associations and their members. CLRC is governed by a Board of Directors composed of six representatives of the breed associations who have been elected by their colleagues to serve in that capacity, as well as the Animal Pedigree Officer appointed by the Minister of Agriculture, Agri-Food Canada. CLRC provides its services to approximately 50 Canadian breed associations, and eight contract associations in the United States and one in Australia. The CLRC is responsible for enforcing the rules and procedures determined by The Belted Galloway Society, Inc. and for collecting the proper fees. The CLRC currently has a staff of eleven persons under direction of General Manager Jim Washer. The staff has many years of experience and knowledge to offer. Caleigh Jerry, is assigned to members of The Belted Galloway Society. In addition to the above services, CLRC also maintains a section of its website on which it posts a listing of members and the pedigrees of animals for each association that chooses to participate. The site is updated frequently from the main database.



CLRC SERVICES

The core registry service provided by CLRC is a complex service consisting of the following basic elements:

- Printing and distribution of application forms.
- · Receipt and deposit of all fees.
- Entry of information from applications into database.
- Manual and computer checking of data and approval of applications, ensuring adherence to rules of eligibility as set down in Society by-laws and to recognized biological parameters.
- · Recording of DNA test results.
- Issuance of certificates, in a format approved by the Society, and membership cards.
- Mailing of documents, including all envelopes and postage.
- Invoice with completed documents that accounts for fees received and charged
- Contact with breeders to resolve problems.
- Acquisition of necessary computer hardware and software and upgrades to same.
- Scanning of all source documents into database, with offsite storage of backup material.
- Reporting to the Society office, including several routine reports, as well as any custom reports that may be required.





