

The Council voted to proceed forward with Digital Beef registration platform through a 3rd party breed association servicer. Details are still being determined as in when the official transition will take place and the new processes and procedures for membership when registering their animals.

The Council acknowledges this will be an adjustment for membership but is optimistic about its success in propelling the association forward by advanced technology, reducing labor from contractors and ease of use.

The Council will be releasing training programs and how-tos for membership to help with the transition.

The Council also addressed some registration concerns from a member while on the call.

GLBGA FIELD DAY

On May 19th and 20th, the Great Lakes Belted Galloway Association held its Annual Field Day in Belvidere, IL at Sunnybrook Farms. Hosted by Terry and Julie Willis (IL), the event proved not only to be educational but a fun Beltie reunion as well!

The event started at the Paulson's Agriculture Museum where attendees were offered an interactive and informative tour of the Museum and its artifacts. Everything from a hand cranked corn shucker, to horse drawn antique farm equipment, to a miniature scene of the town are on display.

John Hamm (WI), of Wisconsin River Meats, talked about marketing your Beltie Beef. Providing his expertise on feeding, growing, selling, and what the current market is looking like for beef producers in our area. John shared his experience with the various auction facilities and how to achieve the best market prices. Open discussion offered even more feeding and selling information for Beltie producers at every stage.

Terry Etheridge (WI), of TEK Cattle, offered his experience and knowledge on a cost-effective way to pregnancy check your females using a simple but accurate blood draw. Demonstrating how to find the correct vein in the tail and offering hands-on experience for those attending. Many that attended shared their experience and techniques for pregnancy checking – including ultrasound.

Julie Willis (IL), of Sunnybrook Farms, demonstrated and provided a great opportunity for discussion on clipping your cattle. Techniques and their clipping schedule were discussed as well as the reasonings behind why they clip their herd to include increasing rate of gain by keeping their animals cool and comfortable, especially in the Illinois summer heat.

Attendees toured Willis's facility and see how they set up their main herd pen, calf pen, bull pen, and heifer pen. Offering new ideas for those attending on ways to creep feed calves for optimum growth and sharing their successes with their setup.

GLBGA held a silent auction, raising money to help support the association and provide more opportunities for our fellow Beltie breeders. John Hamm and Wisconsin River Meats catered for the event with their delicious steaks and sides - no one walked out hungry that is for certain!

Several alumni BYG youth members were challenged to a showmanship contest: Chris and Steve Willis (IL), and Adam McConnell participated. Some of the showmanship skills were a little rusty but the trash talking made for great fun and entertainment for the people watching. Current youth member, Hailey Hillhouse, volunteered to be the fourth participant. Our official judge, Dozier Hendershot, declared Chris Willis the winner.





